Why; it seemed easier this way to not be slashing as their going/moving along the line.

2. What Actually Happened which caused us to deviate from the plan, and why did that happened?

Deep burns and trees falling, windy - they slashed and moved out of way when needed and flagged areas. They cut around it and marked the danger trees. Everyone did good, on time for berifngs, knew roles and stayed safe. NS1 was good with slashing. Good expereince on tree falling. My role as DIVS, need more experince as a fire tech, only on first year (3 weeks on). Will learn more as you go, more paper work to this role. No negative other than Yukon crews - they shut down the pumps since they were over-heating. They need pump experience to know it was fine. Cooks were good, good meals. Water was supplied when asked. Warehouse supplied stuff when needed. Good camp. Locals encounrter at night was pleasant. Good chopper rides.
