<p>1. What was the plan? Talk about size-up, each person's roles going in to the fire.</p> <p>As the medic on incident, I treat those injured and treated all patients to best of my ability. Doing so with the supplied company truck of MTC (Medical Treatment Centre) and other necessary medical supplies. Did this because of that the contract outlined. The incident briefing was good, provided situational awareness. This was my first wildland fire situation.</p>
<p>2. What Actually Happened which caused us to deviate from the plan, and why did that happen?</p> <p>No altercations. If anything, advise patients could use precautionary measures and care to avoid incidents. Wearing their PPE like gloves, could have helped void accidents - using precautionary measures - not adhering to safety protocols.</p> <p>This incident's number of visits was not an abnormal amount of patients and/or severe patients.</p>
<p>3. What are we going to do better next time?</p> <p>Emphasize on PPE - messages were shared with the SOF, to have message delivered in IAP/daily briefing.</p> <p>Provide more details, advise to patients after treatment. Advise frequent followups, some didn't follow up, and what I would have liked to see to ensure proper care was given and there was no more attention needed. For example, the one guy's wrist was tapped, he didn't say anything later on but said nothing had worked. Should have come the next morning to know if the issue resolved itself. It could have issues down the line - so if still sore today, I would advise him to be off the fireline tomorrow. Only thing to do next is rewrap his wrist and provide painkillers, but he has to approach the medic.</p> <p>Next time, discuss follow up procedures - regardless, do a follow up.</p>
