1. What was the plan? Talk about size-up, each person's roles going in to the fire.

What were we thinking going into this? Let each person on the crew/unit/team have a say of what they were thinking and/or planning going to the incident/fire/project. What were you going to do, how were you going to do it, and why were you going to do it that way? Clear task objectives given off the bat @ the eastern Islands. Good direction by Div Sup Quee. No clear plan given by the Yukon team before arriving in the NWT. Good first fire setting the rust off.

2. What Actually Happened which caused us to deviate from the plan, and why did that happen?

Nothing ever goes 100% according to plan. What happened to cause you to alter your plan OR did your plan work without any alterations? Individuals speak about what they did, NOT WHAT OTHER PEOPLE DID to avoid others pointing out what others may have done wrong.

This is the time to speak about why both positive and negative things happened, as well as why the plan had to be changed. Again, individuals speak on what actually happened to them, there should never be finger pointing or people speaking about what another person did.

3. What are we going to do better next time?

If we get a similar fire situation next time what are we going to do? What did we learn? - morning briefings are critical

- Sorting out food for Vegetarian
- Get their outfit to give them reusable water bottles
- Keep a cleaner fireline - bear attractants left
- Cooks where good - All NWT crews were deadly
- Security on Scene - facilities where good - showers
- washer & dryer
