

The incident has established three (3) objectives:

1. Prevent the fire from spreading to the eastern side of the Liard River.
2. Establish 50' blackline on western perimeter of fire.
3. Prevent fire growth while protecting Values at Risk (VARs) in the immediate affected fire areas.



MEDIVAC PLAN

INCIDENT OCCURS

- On scene first aider will assess the injury and provides first aid
- relay the situation up the chain of command **CREW > DIVISION SUPERVISOR**



CALL FOR MEDIVAC

CREW calls FORT LIARD DISPATCH (215) on Channel 4

CREW relays the:

- **NATURE** and **SEVERITY** of **EMERGENCY**
- **LOCATION**
- **EQUIPMENT REQUIRED**
- **Recommends MEDIVAC**

DISPATCH implements radio silence – **ATTENTION ALL STATIONS, CEASE RADIO**



OPERATIONS CHIEF dispatches **XNZ**

- Patient transported off the fire line by **NOU**
- **DISPATCH** will notify **MEDIC** of incoming patient

STANDARD FIREFIGHTING ORDERS

1. Keep informed on fire weather conditions and forecasts.
2. Know what your fire is doing at all times.
3. Base all actions on current and expected behavior of the fire.
4. Identify escape routes and safety zones and make them known.
5. Post lookouts when there is possible danger.
6. Be alert. Keep calm. Think clearly. Act decisively.
7. Maintain prompt communications with your forces, your supervisor, and adjoining forces.
8. Give clear instructions and insure they are understood.
9. Maintain control of your forces at all times.
10. Fight fire aggressively, having provided for safety first.
