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**DANGER TREES**

On September 6 at 17:30, a tree struck a Nodwell in Division B. Fortunately, no one was injured. This near miss is an important reminder that dangerous trees remain a constant hazard on the fire line. Conditions change throughout the day, and no fire line remains the same. Continue to assess and reassess your surroundings every day and throughout each shift.

**Hazards to Watch For - Dangerous Trees & Drought Conditions:**

- Snags and weakened trees – Fire-damaged roots, stems, and crowns can fail without warning.
- Drought stress – Dry soils reduce root stability, making trees more likely to fall.
- Wind shifts – Gusts can bring down weakened trees suddenly.
- Burned-out root systems – Roots and stumps may smolder underground, weakening nearby trees.
- Leaning trees – Especially those hung up in other trees or near equipment lines.
- Active felling operations – Stay clear of designated tree-falling work zones.

**Key Reminders:**

- Always maintain situational awareness around dangerous trees.
- Communicate hazards clearly to your crew and nearby equipment operators.
- Adjust Escape Routes and Safety Zones as conditions change.
- Never become complacent conditions are shifting daily with ongoing drought.

Your safety is the top priority. Stay alert, stay aware, and continue to look out for one another.

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## Spot forecast for: SS014-25

Issued by True North Weather at 12:30 pm Sunday September 7, 2025. Forecast valid for Today, Tonight and Monday with an outlook for the next three days.

### Synopsis

A broad ridge of high pressure north to south across Great Slave Lake will give a light wind regime over the fire area today. Winds will favor an easterly direction. The upper ridge will continue to provide unseasonably warm temperatures. RH readings look to generally stay in the forties. However, under some very clear area they could drop into the lower-mid thirties.

On Monday the ridge will move east and a trough of low pressure will develop through the Mackenzie Valley. This will give a bit tighter pressure gradient across the fire area, with a bit more gusty east-southeast winds. RH readings will be similar to today, and could again fall into the thirties under clear skies. Temperatures will warm a few degrees, with highs some 7 degrees above seasonal.

### Atmospheric Stability and Inversions

An inversion aloft will keep the mixing layer below about 1000m ASL today. With the light winds, venting will be more difficult.

An inversion forming overnight will require a temperature of about 18 to erode on Monday. This occurs near noon. However, adiabatic mixing will be confined to the lower levels, not reaching much height than 800m ASL. Fairly light winds will combine to make venting quite difficult.


