

- Hard Hat with Chin Strap - protects you from falling trees, branches, and flying debris.
- Eye Protection (Safety Glasses or Googles) - Shields your eyes from smoke, ash, embers, and flying particles.
- Hearing Protection (earplugs or muffs when needed) - Guards against noise damage from helicopters, saws, pumps, and heavy equipment.
- Flames-Resistant (FR) Clothing - Nomex or equivalent protects you from radiant heat, flames, and hot embers.
- Leather Gloves - Keeps your hands safe from burns, cuts, sharp tools, and hot equipment.
- Fire Boots (8-inch, lace-up, leather) - Designed to prevent slips, provide ankle support, and resist heat and punctures.

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## ICS 205A Communications List

**Purpose.** The Communications List (ICS 205A) records methods of contact for incident personnel. While the Incident Radio Communications Plan (ICS 205) is used to provide information on all radio frequencies down to the Division/Group level, the ICS 205A indicates all methods of contact for personnel assigned to the incident (radio frequencies, phone numbers, pager numbers, etc.), and functions as an incident directory.

**Preparation.** The ICS 205A can be filled out during check-in and is maintained and distributed by Communications Unit personnel. This form should be updated each operational period.

**Distribution.** The ICS 205A is distributed within the ICS organization by the Communications Unit, and posted as necessary. All completed original forms must be given to the Documentation Unit. If this form contains sensitive information such as cell phone numbers, it should be clearly marked in the header that it contains sensitive information and is not for public release.

**Notes:**

- The ICS 205A is an optional part of the Incident Action Plan (IAP).
- This optional form is used in conjunction with the ICS 205.
- If additional pages are needed, use a blank ICS 205A and repaginate as needed.

**Working Around Heavy Equipment**

Today's reminder is about staying safe when working near our heavy equipment - dozers, excavators, bush babies, and water tenders. These machines are critical tools in our wildfire operations, but they also bring serious hazards.

- **Maintain Situational Awareness** – Heavy equipment operators often have limited visibility. Always assume they may not see you unless you make eye contact.
- **Establish and Respect Exclusion Zones** – Stay clear of operating equipment. Never approach until the operator has stopped, acknowledged you, and it is safe to do so.
- **Communication is Key** – Use radios (**LADD 1**) and hand signals to coordinate. Never enter an equipment work area without first confirming with the operator.
- **Be Aware of Secondary Hazards** – Flying debris, falling trees, and moving vehicles are common around heavy equipment. Always wear your PPE and maintain a lookout.

**Bottom line: Heavy equipment is one of our most effective tools, but it can become one of our biggest hazards if we don't respect the danger zones. Stay visible, stay in communication, and never put yourself in a blind spot.**
