



**7. GENERAL SAFETY MESSAGE**

**Stay Strong—Mind and Body**  
 Fire deployments are physically demanding, mentally exhausting, and emotionally intense. Long hours, remote locations, and high-stress situations can take a serious toll on your mental health—just as much as your physical well-being.

 - **Check in with yourself daily.** Take a moment to pause. Are you feeling overwhelmed, anxious, or unusually irritable? These are signs your mental health needs attention.  
 - **Talk it out.** Whether it's with a teammate, your supervisor, or a mental health support line, sharing what you're experiencing is not a weakness—it's a strategy.  
 - **Support your crew.** Look out for each other. If someone seems off, speak up. Sometimes a quick conversation can make all the difference.

**SAFETY IS OUR TOP PRIORITY**

Today we continue our work securing Divisions A and D, and we need to remain vigilant and disciplined in all areas of the fireline.

- **Dangerous Trees**: Be on the lookout for weakened, burned, or fire-scarred trees that could fall without warning. **DO NOT** work in any that the DTA/Fs have not assessed.

- **Ash Pits**: Stay alert for ash pits, especially in areas of heavy burn. These can cause severe burns and injuries if stepped into. Use tools to check questionable ground before committing your weight.

- **Heavy Equipment Work Areas**: Be aware of the dozer lines. Maintain safe space between personnel and equipment and keep escape routes clear.

- **Smoke Issues**: Smoke continues to be a concern across the divisions. Protect your respiratory health. N95 masks are available and make sure you're using them when needed, especially in heavy smoke pockets.

**Stay aware and report any hazards immediately to your supervisor.**
