

FATIGUE

We are almost at the end of the fire season – LET'S WATCHOUT FOR FATIGUE. Supervisors - you need to recognize the cumulative effects and signs of fatigue in your crews. It may take a little bit of digging and observation to get a true sense of how your staff is doing. Some examples of conditions that can contribute to fatigue are:

- Multiple deployments away from home and living in camp
- Environmental conditions: prolonged exposure to smoke and dust, cooler temps
- Driving to and from the fire; are you sharing the driving responsibilities?
- Strenuous tasks

ARE YOU SEEING SIGNS OF FATIGUE ON YOUR CREW? WHAT CONDITIONS ARE CONTRIBUTING TO FATIGUE? WHAT ACTIONS CAN YOU TAKE TO HELP MANAGE FATIGUE?

Accumulated (Chronic) Fatigue is defined as fatigue from which normal rest does not produce recovery. Accumulated Fatigue is often caused by extended periods of stress with inadequate recovery periods, which results in decreased productivity, compromised immune function, and reduced alertness. Fatigued workers perform poorly, behave carelessly, tolerate greater errors, and become inattentive.

Fatigue and Sleep

It is proven that the body functions best with 7-8hrs of sleep. Routine lack of sleep can lead to a *Sleep Deficit* which has cumulative effects. This is the most common contributing factor of fatigue. It is built up slowly over consecutive nights or shortened or interrupted sleep. This can result in a decline in performance such as:

- Reduced state of alertness and reactions times
- Reduced capacity to evaluate hazards and respond to changes
- Inability to concentrate and make reasonable judgements

Your body is the most important equipment you use – you need to keep this tuned!
