<p>Major Hazards and Risks</p> <p>Fatigue and Dehydration- Accumulated (chronic) Fatigue is defined as fatigue from which normal rest does not produce recovery. Accumulated fatigue is often caused by extended periods of stress with inadequate recovery periods, which results in decreased productivity, compromised immune function, and reduced alertness. Staying hydrated will reduce the risk of fatigue. Fatigued workers perform poorly, behave carelessly, tolerate greater errors, and become inattentive.</p> <p>Slips, Trips, Falls- High humidity and precipitation create slippery conditions. Slipping while carrying heavy weight can cause serious injury. Be careful when walking across logs, trees, rocks, muddy areas, and slopes. If you slip while carrying a sharp tool such as a chainsaw or Pulaski, let go of the tool to your side to avoid landing on sharp edges.</p> <p>Overexertion- Overexerting yourself can cause injuries, fatigue, dehydration and heat exhaustion. Lift with your legs, not your back, and avoid twisting. Share the work load between each other and work together.</p>


