

Each firefighter must know and address LACES: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Lookouts • Anchor Points • Communications • Escape routes • Safety zones <p>Select Lookouts (utilize both air and ground) to assess and reassess the fire environment; make sure your lookout can view the fire in relationship with your fire crew.</p> <p>Establish Anchor Points, all constructed fire line must start and end at an anchor point; which is a barrier to fire spread.</p> <p>Set-up Communications, ensure that you fully understand the instructions that you have been given and that the instruction you have given are understood. Ensure you are in contact with someone who can supply you with intelligence.</p> <p>Escape routes, always have a minimum of 2 escape routes that lead to viable Safety Zones and ensure that you give yourself enough time to safety travel to the safety zone.</p> <p>Let's not lose sight of what our number 1 priority is out here....and that's our safety!!!</p>

Be a professional passenger

DRIVING is consistently one of the riskiest activities we do. Between the water tenders, equipment, and amount of crew activity in and around our incident there is a lot of traffic use and high consequence scenarios.

Couple of reminders:

- 1) Expect increase residential traffic when commuting to and from your incident and leave at least a 3 second gap with the vehicle in front of you.
- 2) Watch your speeds in residential areas.
- 3) If working along side or a road or HWY, ensure proper signage is being used and place pylons appropriately to ensure a safe work zone around the vehicles.
- 4) Watch-out for signs of fatigue, especial in the morning and evening when you're travelling to and from the fireground.
- 5) Avoid distracted driving - focus on the road and driving and don't use your phone.
- 6) Drive with lights on at all times.
- 7) Use four way flashers in dusty or heavy smoke conditions.
- 8) Leave the navigation and communication to the passengers.

WEATHER SUMMARY

New system will significantly reduce fire behaviour for days, but no season ending rain in sight.

Today - Max 17C, Min 68%, NW 10-15G20-25 3-5mm Today will be cool and damp as a cold front slowly passes through the area. Skies will be fully overcast all day today and small amounts of precip are likely to fall throughout the day. Winds will be gusty out of the NE in the morning, then calm down before shifting to be from the NW as gusts pick back up.

Monday - Max 11, Min 47%, W 10-20G25-30 1-2mm Cool, damp and overcast again today. A possibility for some more spits of precip in the morning. Things will start warming and drying in the late afternoon before a new front passes through switching to gustier E winds as temps drop and RH rises.

Tuesday - Max 8, Min 86%, ENE 10-20G20-30 2-3mm Cool, damp and overcast conditions persist. Another chance for a few mm of precip mid day. Winds will be quite gusty in the AM, but calm in the PM before yet another front passes through and switches the winds back to NLY and winds pick back up.

Wednesday - Max 6, Min 71%, NNW 15G25 Cool, damp and overcast conditions persist. Not likely to receive any more precip today, other than small spits here and there. Winds will be steadily from the N or NNW throughout the day. Wednesday may be the last day that is fully overcast, though the generally cool/moist conditions will still remain for a few more days before temps return to seasonal.

MEDICAL PROCEDURES

For any illness or injury that is not critical, radio to your Division Supervisor or Operations Chief and identify the nature of injury. Relay to them if a helicopter or vehicle is required to take the individual to a medic for assessment or to the ICP to be transported to the hospital.

If the illness or injury appears critical and requires medical assistance to move the patient safely, call the Division Supervisor or Operations Chief and request a medivac. Do not move the patient and the Medic will be flown into the location. If the decision is made to transport the patient directly to the hospital, notify the radio operator and transport the patient to the Hay River Health Center.

AOBD is to ensure medivac machine is ready, the Safety Officer and/or the IC are to communicate the incident to the Hay River Duty Officer who will notify the hospital of the incoming patient.

Primary Medivac Machine will be **FJY** Bell 205.
