



### Wildfire After Action Review

1. What was the plan? Talk about size-up, each person's roles going in to the fire.

ZF018 Fire was large to the point that Direct attack was not an option. The Plan was for DRH with Brent and Chris to bidn off the other side of the river with the Dragon. Eggs while N54 and N56 hold the south side of river from jumps with support from NOL and buckets. after the south side was anchored the North west was to be hand to hand and cut off from fuel. the west side was to burn in to an old burn and slow down.

2. What Actually Happened which caused us to deviate from the plan, and why did that happen?

The first two burns were successful with limited jump and successful in on jumps. the last two dragon egg burns. The crews set up sprinkler lines with great success. The fire jumped the last sprinkler set up almost 75 kilometers away and crews had no line to reach a target that far away. Brent had a ready dispatched tanker to the fire when burning off. The fire layed a column of smoke across the river from one hill to the next see figer → 

This made the two columns of smoke come together and greatly impeded vision for tankers. Though bird dog and tankers made two attempts at the jump fire it was simply too dangerous. NOL showed up and bucketted the jump while crews moved in with hand tools and the jump was contained. The next few days the crews were to hand torch and EA pinch points on the North east side with great success. the day following the crews moved over to cut offs and anchor points on the north west side with limited success. 4 hoses were lost when YH20 and N56

3. What are we going to do better next time? when pulled to go back to west side to in local fuel

the limited success on the New Plank was in part due to the helicopter not being available in week end until 14:00-15:00 most days coupled with intense fire behaviour. allocate resources to action more effectively. If given enough time with helicopter equipment would not have been lost and there would have been more success on the New Plank. Fire was contained throughout the summer and was never a risk to values after containing.
